Xavier University Students Awarded Truman Capote Creative Writing Scholarships

New Orleans LA – Three Xavier University of Louisiana students have been awarded \$13,333 scholarships to study creative writing during the 2018-19 academic year through a grant funded by the Truman Capote Foundation Trust.

The monetary awards, divided over two semesters, are designed to encourage talented writers to develop their writing skills at Xavier, the first Historically Black College and University (HBCU) to offer a creative writing minor. The scholarship winners were selected via a competitive process.

The scholarship winners are: Deja Dennis, a sophomore mass communication major from Peoria IL (Peoria High School); Kiara Houston, a freshman neuroscience major from Chicago IL (Chicago-Arts High); and Tresaundra Roberson, a freshman psychology/premed major from New Orleans (Lusher High). Dennis is a repeat winner, having earned a scholarship in last year's competition.

Randolph Thomas, an award-winning professor at LSU, poet, and short fiction writer, served as judge of this year's competition. He had these comments on the three scholarship winners' entries:

Dennis: "Ms. Dennis submitted five poems, all very different in style and subject manner, and for each one her sense of language, line, sounds, all worked very well. For each poem, she seemed very much in control of the form. She used inventive word choices throughout that really brought her poems to life."

Houston: "Ms. Houston submitted four short stories and each is outstanding. She is able to capture complicated characters and relationships, and clearly depicts the realistic action of her stories in a truly masterful way. Although very short, each seemed complete and often disturbing. She takes the reader to a very dangerous place, and often the story ends there."

Roberson: "Ms. Roberson submitted five poems, and I found their quality to be consistent and overall strong. She had tremendous control over the sounds of her poems through occasional repetition and variation, and through the line-breaks that force the reader to make surprising realizations. Also I found her word choice to be very powerful."

The scholarship program is funded by the Truman Capote Foundation Trust, which since 2000 has provided more than \$300,000 in scholarship funding to Xavier. The University's English Department and the Division of Fine Arts and Humanities supports the creative writing program's membership in the
